Fall/Winter Meetings and Workshops

This fall and winter, there will be several workshops and meetings for youth and 4-H families to attend. As the dates approach, more details and sign-up links will be sent out. Here's a brief description of each workshop/meeting. More workshops and meetings might be added as the year progresses.

- **Resume Writing Workshop (October 16)**: This workshop will help youth develop their resume writing skills. This class is geared toward high school students, but middle school-age kids are welcome.
- Officer Training (October 23): This meeting is for new and returning officers, club leaders, and anyone who is interested in being an officer in the future. We'll go over the expectations of your office.
- New Member Meeting (December 4): This meeting will help get new 4-H families familiar with Reno County 4-H. We'll outline what to expect and give them time to ask question.

ACHIEVEMENT PIN APPLICATIONS

Achievement pins are awarded to 4-Hers who have been active in 4-H projects, leadership and other 4-H related activities. Pin applications should contain 4-H activities from October 1, 2023 through September 30, 2024. If you have activities that take place between the date you have to turn them into the club leader and Sept. 30th, go ahead and list them. Achievement pins (in order of increasing requirements) are:

1-Membership 6-Silver Guard 2-Bronze 7-Leadership 3-Clover 8-Gold 4-Emerald 9-Gold Guard 5-Silver

If you need Achievement pin applications, check our website, click on 4-H forms and achievement pin applications. The link will be in the bottom right-hand corner.

All applications must be turned in to your <u>CLUB LEADER</u>. Check with your club leader to see what date you have to turn them into the club leader. <u>Club Leaders</u>: <u>Pin Applications are due on Friday</u>, <u>October 4</u>, <u>2024</u>, <u>by 5 pm</u>. Achievement pins will be awarded at Achievement Night the date & location to be announced at a later date.

RECORD BOOKS

I encourage each 4-Her to complete a record book and turn it into their club leader (please do not bring them to the office – your club leader will do that).
